Ms. Kathleen Toner, Programme Officer, and Ms. Raya Duenas, Programme Associate, Population Programme, The David and Lucile Packard Foundation - California office, USA and Dr. Iftikhar Ahmed, Programme Associate, Population Programme, The David and Lucile Packard Foundation - Pakistan office visited SEDC on March 20, 2008.

They commended the efforts of SEDC in strengthening the social sector in capacity building of its human capital. The main focus of their discussion was regarding the concept paper Health Enterprise Leadership-Development Programme (HELP) which had been developed by SEDC and presented to The David and Lucile Packard Foundation. The delegation met Dr. Syed Mubashir Ali, Director SEDC and Associate Dean Suleman Dawood School of Business, and Javaid William, Manager SEDC to discuss how the concept paper could be developed further into a project proposal.

Training

1. Social Enterprise Management Programme (SEMP)

SEMP provides training to social enterprise managers from across the country. Since its inception in 2003, training has been imparted to 229 NGO Managers. During this quarter, the third and fourth module of SEMP Cohort 6 (September 2007-June 2008) took place at LUMS.

SEMP Third Module

The third module "Operations Management and Programme Planning" was held from January 21 - February 2, 2008 at the Rausing Executive Development Centre (REDC) Auditorium II. Dr. Jamshed H Khan was the Course Director for the module. Other faculty members included Dr. Kamran A. Chatha, Dr. M Farooq Anwar, Dr. Muhammad Ramzan and Dr. Farzad Rafi Khan. Ms Bushra Khanum, Dr. Naeem Zafar, and Mr Javaid William had been invited as guest speakers from the social sector to share their experiences and knowledge on community mobilization, participatory development and Logical Framework Approach (LFA).

According to the participants, the sessions on operations management, Microsoft Project, Work Breakdown Structures were well articulated, whereas, the sessions on Project Management and Planning and Logical Framework Approach (LFA) were particularly relevant and useful to their area of expertise.

A total of 33 NGO managers from all over Pakistan participated in the module (13 females). According to the participants, there was a good selection of topics covered. Some participants said the subject was new to them but the module had helped in providing some basic concepts related to financial reporting, financial management and budgeting. The group assignments and presentations were also helpful in giving the participants an understanding and practice of the concepts introduced.

Development of Teaching Material (DTM) Task signs a contract with ECCH

A contract has been signed with European Case Clearing House (ECCH), Cranfield University, whereby ECCH will display, distribute and sell 110 cases and notes developed so far by DTM Task, against a royalty payable to LUMS. The material under this contract also includes Urdu translations of 75 DTM cases.

The cases and notes will also be made available by ECCH on McKinsey on-line access, CasePlace, Case Centre Japan and through Babson College, USA.

Incidentally, all DTM cases/notes were earlier accepted for display on the database of Asian Business Case Centre, Nanyang University. The material will be uploaded by them shortly.
